

I do talk about myself but I don't mention names. I'm not doing a psychotherapy ses-

"I try to make a journey for the show with a beginning, middle and an end and it follows the ups and downs of young love, heartbreak and then the mature stage of love, when we become more adult about it and are able to cope with the emotions."

Peter isn't sure what the future holds but he hopes this concert might open some more doors for him in Scotland. He also says there is no special person in his life at the moment: "Here I am doing a show about love but I'm OK about that because I love what I am doing!

"Every journey should be scary - I really believe that – if everything was so comfortable then we wouldn't learn anything and we wouldn't grow."
